The City Council of the City of Kirksville, Missouri, met in Special Session on Wednesday, September 7, 2005, at 4:00 p.m. in the Kirksville City Hall Council Chambers.

Action Presentations

City Manager Macomber stated the Council had a list of names they wish to consider for appointment to the Council, and parties who had expressed an interest to be appointed, to fill the unexpired term of Debbie Masten who recently resigned from the Council as a result of moving from Kirksville. Those to be considered were: Ralph Cupelli, Jeff Newton, Chuck Cannaday and Sterling Ruddy.

Councilmember Stewart moved to appoint Ralph Cupelli as Councilmember to complete the remainder of the three-year term until April 2006; seconded by Councilmember Rowe. The motion resulted in a tie vote as follows: Mayor Pro Tem Crist, nay; Councilmember Rowe, aye; Councilmember Scott, nay; Councilmember Stewart, aye. Ayes - 2; Nays - 2.

Councilmember Scott moved to appoint Jeff Newton as Councilmember to complete the remainder of the three-year term until April 2006. No second.

Councilmember Scott moved to appoint Chuck Cannaday as Councilmember to complete the remainder of the three-year term until April 2006. No second.

City Manager Macomber reported the Downtown Cinema 8 had an electrical fire this past weekend. Timber Ridge Church had been using the theater facility for their Sunday services. They have secured use of the Courthouse lawn property, and have asked that Washington Street be closed before, during and following the services. The necessary insurance has not be submitted yet, but closure approval is contingent upon the insurance being submitted by this Friday.

Councilmember Stewart moved to close the Washington Street area for the Church's usage this Sunday, September 11, allowing the Church to announce to their congregation to move the following Sunday's service to Rotary Park, and contingent upon insurance receipt by this Friday; seconded by Councilmember Scott. The motion carried by the following vote: Mayor Pro Tem Crist, aye; Councilmember Rowe, aye; Councilmember Scott, aye; Councilmember Stewart, aye. Nays, none.

City Manager Macomber and the City Attorney advised the Council that the Mayor Pro Tem can step aside from the presiding officer position to make a motion or to second a motion.

Mayor Pro Tem Crist stated that he wished to step aside from the Mayor Pro Tem position, and moved to appoint Jeff Newton as Councilmember to complete the remainder of the three-year term until April 2006; seconded by Councilmember Scott. The motion resulted in a tie vote as follows: Mayor Pro Tem Crist, aye; Councilmember Rowe, nay; Councilmember Scott, aye; Councilmember Stewart, nay. Ayes - 2; Nays - 2.

Mari Macomber handed out packets for the Council Retreat scheduled this Friday at 1:00 p.m., and Saturday at 8:00 a.m. in the second floor conference room of City Hall. The Council will be discussing the 2005 goals.

Adjournment

There being no further business to come before the Council, Mayor Pro Tem Crist adjourned the meeting at 4:17 p.m.
