The City Council of the City of Kirksville, Missouri, met in a Special Session on Monday, June 20, 2005, at 5:07 p.m. in the City Hall Council Chambers.

OLD BUSINESS

Councilmember Stewart moved to remove from the table a motion to approve a bid for two backhoes (tabled on May 23, 2005); seconded by Councilmember Scott.

Councilmember Rowe asked if the annexation work will be slowed down if the backhoes purchase is not approved? Paul Hazen responded that the work will slow down some, but they will use some other equipment to keep going.

Ray Sandstrom pointed out that the bids are good until the end of July.

Councilmember Stewart asked about buying a track hoe and a backhoe instead of two backhoes. Paul Hazen said he would look into the benefits of a track hoe versus a backhoe.

Mayor Masten suggested that the Public Works Department meet to discuss the needs of all divisions.

Mayor Pro Tem Crist moved to table the purchase of two backhoes. For lack of a second, the motion to table failed.

The original motion to approve a bid for two backhoes failed by the following vote: Mayor Masten, nay; Mayor Pro Tem Crist, nay; Councilmember Rowe, aye; Councilmember Scott, nay; Councilmember Stewart, aye. Nays - 3; Ayes - 2.

ACTION PRESENTATIONS

BILL NO. 2005-28

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OF THE CITY OF KIRKSVILLE TO

ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF ADAIR; TRUMAN STATE UNIVERSITY AND THE STATE OF MISSOURI TO PROVIDE FOR THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN A MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ENFORCEMENT GROUP AS THAT GROUP IS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 195.505 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF MISSOURI AND FOR THE PURPOSES AS SET FORTH THEREIN.

Councilmember Rowe moved to adopt Bill No. 2005-28 on first reading; seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Crist.

Police Chief Hughes reported the Adair County Meth Coalition received federal grant funding to assist with efforts to combat substance/drug abuse in Adair County. Meth enforcement/investigation was divided into four multi-agencies, as provided for in Missouri Statutes 195.505, consisting of the City of Kirksville, County of Adair, Truman State University and the Missouri Highway Patrol. One of the programs will be the "Knock and Talk" program. Chief Hughes said this agreement will allow for the best use of available resources to combat meth in this area. The four representatives, consisting of Jim Hughes; Leonard Clark, County Sheriff; Tom Roan, Highway Patrol; and Tom Johnson, TSU Public Safety, meet and discuss what is to be done.

Mayor Masten stated disapproval of other entities having enforcement abilities in the city, and city manpower tax dollars being spent to go into the county on assignments. She further stated that she would like to see the final agreement after a few suggested changes are made to it.

City Manager Macomber explained that Mark Williams had requested action on this ordinance to be considered on June 6, but was delayed until June 20.

The motion carried by the following vote: Mayor Masten, nay; Mayor Pro Tem Crist, aye; Councilmember Rowe, aye; Councilmember Scott, aye; Councilmember Stewart, aye. Ayes - 4; nays - 1.

BILL NO. 2005-28 **ORDINANCE NO. 11714**
AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER OF THE CITY OF KIRKSVILLE TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF ADAIR; TRUMAN STATE UNIVERSITY AND THE STATE OF MISSOURI TO PROVIDE FOR THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN A MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ENFORCEMENT GROUP AS THAT GROUP IS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 195.505 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF MISSOURI AND FOR THE PURPOSES AS SET FORTH THEREIN.

WHEREAS, methamphetamine (meth) abuse is a problem in Northern Missouri; and

WHEREAS, the Adair County Meth Coalition (ACMC) received a grant to specifically combat this meth abuse in Adair County; and

WHEREAS, the grant seeks to maximize the limited law enforcement resources in the County in a series of collaborative multi-jurisdictional enforcement projects; and

WHEREAS, the proposed ordinance is recommended in order to allow the Kirksville Police Department to participate in this multi-jurisdictional enforcement group.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF KIRKSVILLE, MISSOURI, THAT THE CITY MANAGER IS AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF ADAIR; TRUMAN STATE UNIVERSITY AND THE STATE OF MISSOURI TO PROVIDE FOR THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN A MULTI-JURISDICTIONAL ENFORCEMENT GROUP AS THAT GROUP IS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 195.505 OF THE REVISED STATUTES OF MISSOURI AND FOR THE PURPOSES SET FORTH THEREIN AS FOLLOWS.

Councilmember Rowe moved to adopt Bill No. 2005-28 on second reading; seconded by Mayor Pro Tem Crist. The motion carried by the following vote: Mayor Masten, nay; Mayor Pro Tem Crist, aye; Councilmember Rowe, aye; Councilmember Scott, aye; Councilmember Stewart, aye. Ayes - 4; nays - 1.
