RESOLUTION NO. R4-4-614

Bid - Removal of Sludge from Wastewater Treatment Plant

Councilmember Chrisman moved to authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with Oros & Busch Application Technologies, Inc. for removal and land application of biosolids from the Wastewater Treatment Plant holding basin for a period of three years; seconded by Councilmember Fajkus.

John Buckwalter reported this contract is for removal of up to 200 dry tons of biosolids each year. Oros & Busch's bid was \$177 per dry ton for 2011; \$184 for 2012; and \$191 in 2013.

Bid - Concrete Repair

Councilmember Chrisman moved to authorize the City Manager to execute an agreement with Mihalevich Concrete Construction for concrete repair for Utility maintenance projects in the amount to be determined based on the actual quantity of work completed by the contractor; seconded by Councilmember Fajkus.

John Buckwalter reported the low bid was \$69,910.80, and the engineer's estimate was \$65,000.
