CLOSED SESSION

As a reminder, the City Council will go into closed executive session following the Council meeting on Monday evening.

CITY COUNCIL FILING

The Council terms of Richard Detweiler and Tony Fajkus will expire in April, 2013. Filing for the two positions opened at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, December 11, 2012, in the City Clerk's office. The filing period will close at 5:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 15, 2013. The General Election will be held on Tuesday, April 2. There have been two citizens file to date - Kevin A. Alm and Brandon Athon.

STATE OF THE CITY

The Governmental Affairs Committee has asked the City to prepare for the State of the City. The date for our event will be Monday, January 7 at 4:30 pm. It will be held in lieu of a Study Session that evening. Over the last few years we have had department

managers make the presentations. Prior to that, the Mayor made the presentation using a slide show. Since our focus has been on performance measures, the theme we are working on is “The City by the Numbers”. The presentation will take anywhere from 30 minutes to an hour. The Council should discuss your participation and the best manner of presentation.

MML BOARD VACANCY

The Missouri Municipal League has a vacancy on its Board of Directors. The MML Bylaws call for a 17 member board consisting of 12 elected officials and five appointed officials. The seat that is open is for an elected official. If appointed, it would require attendance at MML board meetings, which would include both the legislative and annual conferences. Would a member of our Council be interested in submitting your name for consideration?

CITIZEN COMMENT

Mr. Elliot Asbed, 815 S Davis Street attended the Council meeting on Monday, December 3rd to voice his concerns regarding “the current ban on Pit Bull dog breed in the Kirksville area.” He would like to start an initiative to repeal the current ordinance that places restrictions on certain animals. The City’s ordinance is not a ban. Pit Bulls are allowed within the city limits but there are requirements placed upon the owner. The specific section of the current ordinance that relates to restricted animals is included with this Newsletter. The Council should decide if they would like to revisit the current ordinance and make any changes. The portion of the ordinance that refers to Pit Bull Dogs is attached to this newsletter.

KDIC MEETING

The KDIC had its first official meeting after reorganizing on December 4th with 10 people in attendance. The KDIC is collecting donations for Santa on the Square, and hoping to start some new events in the future. The KDIC renewed their membership with the Chamber of Commerce, and plans to work closely with the Chamber. The KDIC will be reviewing their By-Laws and mission statement, to clarify the focus of the Commission and determine what qualifications must be met to be a member. A new Membership Committee has been formed to begin brainstorming ideas for membership dues, incentives, and initiatives. The KDIC will be meeting with the presidents of ATSU and Truman State University in the near future to determine how the Universities and Commission can assist each other. Sarah Halstead serves as the City Representative on the committee.

UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI EXTENSION COUNCIL UPDATE

The Extension Council recently made a few revisions to review their By-Laws that effect the City’s representative on the council. The original By-laws called for 19 members, 1 member elected from each of the 5 E-911 districts with, each having 3 representatives, and 1 appointed City of Kirksville member, 1 MFA member, 1 County Commission, 1 by the Farm Bureau. It has been a struggle to fill all the 19 positions and have quorum for meetings. The By-Laws have been changed to state that they need to have 15 members, and in addition, Representatives from the Farm Bureau, the County

Commission, MFA and City of Kirksville are appointed voting members but will not be considered in quorum requirements to conduct council business.

ANNUAL CHAMBER BANQUET

The Kirksville Chamber of Commerce is planning their annual Chamber Banquet. They have assembled a planning committee; Heather Darrah is serving as the City's representative on this committee. The committee has met twice and confirmed that Days Inn will be the venue. The banquet will be held on Thursday January 17th starting 6 pm. If anyone would like to attend please let Vickie Brumbaugh know and the City will register you and purchase your ticket. The cost of the event is \$25 each through the end of the month and then \$30 in January.

HERITAGE HOUSE ANNIVERSARY

Heritage House Realty is celebrating 35 yrs in Kirksville as of December 7th. The City has mailed a card to Ken Read at Heritage House. The Council may want to say congratulations on this milestone, if you see Mr. Read.

EMPLOYEESMOKING BAN ARTICLE

The Council has discussed employee smoking several times as it relates to wellness and health insurance premiums. Currently, employees are encouraged to stop smoking through local smoking cessation classes but the City doesn't have a formal no smoking policy for current or potential employees. Pat Meredith, Human Resources Director, recently sent the article that addressed this topic and it is included in the attachments for your review only.

MARTIN TRAILER PARK

The City had taken Joyce and Raymond Martin to court for weeds, grass and vegetation in violation of city ordinance. The case was determined last week with both Martin's receiving probation for two years and the following requirements: they must repair the potholes in the hard surface areas; provide a list of mobile home park residents to the City; and repay the City \$14,083 in back payments for water usage due to their lack of maintenance on their private water line.

CANNADAY PROPERTIES

The Codes Department filed a total of 12 cases in the past year against Charles M. Cannaday, at 415 E. Pierce, for trash and rubbish, grass and weed height, exterior storage of materials and equipment, parking of construction vehicles on public streets, and operating a business in a residential zone. This is the culmination of two years of work trying to bring this property into compliance with city ordinances. A year ago, this same court determined that Mr. Cannaday was guilty of trash and rubbish charges, but did not require him to clean anything up. He would not clean up the property, and we had no choice but to charge him again, to get compliance. We brought charges again and this week the Court found him guilty on 10 of the 12 charges. One was found Not Guilty on a technicality. The other was found Not Guilty because the Judge did not believe Mr. Cannaday was an "agent" for his father's property at a different location on a grass and weeds charge. The 10 guilty verdicts have a total of \$875 in fines and fees,

but the more important facts are that Mr. Cannaday is now required to clean up the property to the satisfaction of the Codes Department by January 24, 2013, he can no longer park his business vehicles at his residential property, he cannot park his construction vehicles on the public streets, and that he has to keep his property free of trash and rubbish. He has been placed on 2 years of probation for these charges. These charges are not considered final until 30 days after being published, which is January 13. Until that time, he could ask for a new trial or an amendment of the judgment, but we don't expect that.

CAPITOL EVENTS

The City will be participating in the upcoming Kirksville Day at the Capitol and Northeast Missouri Day at the Capitol. The dates are February 13 in the evening (NEMO Day) and February 20 for Kirksville Day at the Capitol. Please let Vickie Brumbaugh know if you wish to attend either event.

b)

Pit bull dogs residing in the city on or after April 1, 2011, may only be kept by their owners within the city, subject to the following standards:

(1)

Registration. Pit bull dogs currently residing in the city must be registered with the city by the owner(s) within sixty (60) days of April 1, 2011. Annual registration of any pit bull dog is required. Any pit bull dog four (4) months of age or older must be registered.

(2)

Leash. No person shall permit a pit bull dog to go outside of a securely enclosed fenced yard unless such dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than four (4) feet in length. No person shall permit a pit bull dog to be kept on a chain, rope or other type of leash outside its securely enclosed fenced yard unless a person is in physical control of the leash. Such dogs may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, buildings, etc.

(3)

Confinement outdoors. All pit bull dogs shall be confined in a securely enclosed fenced yard, except when leashed as provided in [section 5-20](#) (b) (2) of this section. Such fence must have secure sides and be at least sixty (60) inches in height. All gates in fenced yards used to confine pit bull dogs must be locked with a key, or combination lock, when such animals are within the fenced area. All fencing erected to house pit bull dogs must comply with all zoning and building regulations of the city.

(4)

Confinement indoors. No pit bull dog may be kept on a porch, patio, or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit such building on its own volition. In addition, no such animal may be kept in a house or structure when the windows are open or when screen windows or screen doors are the only obstacle preventing the dog from exiting the structure.

(5)

Insurance. All owners, keepers, or harborers of pit bull dogs must provide proof to the city of public liability insurance in a single incident amount of one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00) for bodily injury to or death of any person or for damage to property owned by any person, which may result from the ownership, keeping, or maintenance of such animal. Such insurance policy shall provide that no cancellation of the policy will be made unless ten (10) days' written notice is first given to the city. Any person found to be the owner, keeper, or harbinger of a pit bull dog that does not have insurance on the same, and is found guilty in municipal court or any other court of this violation, must permanently remove the animal from the city.

(6)

Certification. Owners of pit bull dogs, whose dogs are registered as required in [section 5-20](#) (b)(1) of this section, who can show proof of current certification for their pit bull dogs from the American Kennel Club Canine Good Citizen (AKC CGC) Program to the Kirksville Police Department will be exempted for so long as the AKC CGC Certification remains valid from [5-20\(b\)\(3\)](#) and [5-20\(b\)\(5\)](#).

(7)

Irrefutable presumptions. There shall be an irrefutable presumption that any dog registered with the city as a pit bull dog, or any of those breeds that are restricted under the definition of "pit bull dog", is in fact a dog subject to the requirements of this section.

Article regarding regulating employee smoking

Virginia's Fairfax County Board of Supervisors is looking into whether it's legal to regulate employee behaviors that put their health at risk, reports *The Washington Examiner*.

Supervisors have asked the county attorney, David Bobzien, to determine whether they can legally require employees to quit smoking or if they can institute a ban on hiring smokers. Although Supervisor Gerry Hyland's proposal to study the issue has full support, not all board members support the idea itself.

"We have smokers who work for Fairfax County who are valuable employees," County Board Chairwoman Sharon Bulova told *The Examiner*. "People have a free will."

Fairfax joins several other jurisdictions and states that are looking at new ways to lower the cost of employee health care. A bill in nearby Montgomery County, Md., would make it illegal to smoke on county property, according to the paper. In 2012, the average monthly cost of insurance per employee for state governments was \$496.25 -- up from \$467.25 the year before.

Some cities across the country have taken to opening up [employee health clinics](#) as a way to curtail the rising costs of health care. In Lakeland, Fla., the city saved \$1.1 million one year after opening a "preventive medicine" wellness clinic in its main offices. Employee participation had grown from 67 percent to 87 percent in the first few years after the clinic opened. Cities in Tennessee, Texas and Colorado have opened similar on-site health clinics for their employees.






