COUNCIL STUDY SESSION

On Monday we will be going to Thousand Hills State Park to tour the lake. If you would like a ride out there, please be at my office no later than 3:40 pm so we can load up and get to the lake. Missouri Department of Conservation has rented a pontoon boat from 4 pm to 5 pm. The boat will accommodate 12 people. Mike Anderson with Conservation, Jeremy Kolb, 1000 Hills Concessionaire, Jim Hughes and Randy Behrens will all be attending. If there is rain, we will proceed to the dining lodge.

COUNCIL WORK SESSION

The City Council desires to meet with a local entity each month through the year except for April due to the election; and November and December due to the holidays. The Council is scheduled to meet with the Adair County Commissioners on Tuesday, May 28, at 3:30 p.m. in the City Hall second floor conference room, to talk about items of mutual interest. These work sessions are usually held at 4:00 p.m., but that is the end of the work day for Commissioners, therefore, this Work Session is at 3:30 p.m. to accommodate their work time.

MML ELECTED OFFICIALS TRAINING

June 13 & 14 are the dates for the Elected Officials training, sponsored by the Missouri Municipal League, held in Jefferson City. The tentative agenda is attached. This is an excellent opportunity to meet other Mayors and Council members from surrounding communities, plus the training for your position. Please let Vickie Brumbaugh know if you plan to attend so that travel arrangements can be made. The City covers the cost for travel, meals, hotel and registration.

PSEUDOEPHEDRINE

Some members of Council have received information from Sheriff Hardwick requesting that the City further restrict the purchase of over-the-counter medicine containing pseudoephedrine (the main ingredient in the manufacturing of methamphetamine). A number of other cities in Missouri have done something similar. As most of you know Missouri is the number one meth state in the Country, and has been so for many years. Through May 1st of this year the Police Department has been involved in 12 separate meth labs in the City. Although a community initiative a few years back was successful in reducing meth use in the area, problems are once again on the rise. The State currently requires anyone who purchases pseudoephedrine produce identification and be limited on the amount that can be purchased. Local law enforcement does access these "pill logs" and uses them in meth investigations/prosecutions. In 2012 there were at least 16,932 boxes of these products sold in Kirksville (from six retailers). The current law resulted in 889 attempts to purchase being blocked. A significant percentage of those actually making such purchases are known to law enforcement (which does not necessarily mean that they are making meth). At its most basic; Sheriff Hardwick's proposal is that the City passes a municipal ordinance that requires any pseudoephedrine purchase be a result of a prescription from a qualified medical professional. The biggest community advantage from this program would be the reduction in purchases of this critical ingredient in meth (and all of the associated negative fallout from this problem). The biggest disadvantage would be requiring people (many of whom are not making meth) to interact with a physician and obtain a prescription to obtain this over-the-counter medication. This will likely add some additional costs and create access issues (especially in the evenings, weekends and holidays). Somewhat related is a Police Department interest in restricting the possession and use of synthetic cannabinoids (known generically as K2 and Spice) and bath salts (which have nothing to do with true bath salts). This has nothing to do with marijuana. Both of these products are manufactured in the laboratory. Both are being advertised for sale for non drug purposes, but, based on a number of other indicators are clearly sold for drug usage. A little research on the internet will produce a lot of fairly scary information. The problem with the current limited State and Federal laws, since these are designer type drugs manufactured in the lab, is as soon as someone makes a certain substance illegal someone else will change a molecule and produce a very closely related substance whose formulation is not among banned substances. Both of these man-made chemicals are linked with potentially severe physical and psychological responses that are causing significant problems for law enforcement and the medical community. A municipal ordinance could be crafted that may be more flexible than those that currently exist at the State and Federal level. As a municipal

ordinance, a local law could more easily be updated as new variants are produced. As opposed to pseudoephedrine, there is no recognized legitimate human use for these designer products. How would Council like to proceed?

FRANKLIN STREET UPDATE

The work is continuing on Phase 1 of the Franklin Street Project. The overlay work is being completed on Friday, May 17. Parking restrictions in the area will be lifted before the weekend. Depending on weather, the pavement marking will be done next week.

SWIMMING AT THOUSAND HILLS STATE PARK

The City has been contacted by the Division of State Parks regarding changes to the swimming beach area at Thousand Hills State Park. The swimming beach has been run by the park concessionaire for many years and is the only beach that is not operated by the state. Beginning this summer, Missouri State Parks will manage the beach operations and it will become a free swim/swim at your own risk beach. Missouri State Parks has assured us they will continue to maintain the dressing rooms, the fencing around the area, the sand beach and the water in the swim area. They plan to have the beach open for swimming from 10 am to 7 pm each day with the gate closed during the off hours. We have requested a letter detailing this information from Dan Files, District Supervisor for Missouri State Parks. If problems arise, the Council may need to review the current ordinances and decide if swimming on Forest Lake needs to be restricted.

ADVANCED DISPOSAL OFFERS COMMERCIAL RECYCLING

Advanced Disposal Trash Service is now offering recycling service to commercial customers. Commercial customers can contact Advanced Disposal at 800-778-7652 for a quote. The recycling service is cart recycling every other week and the cost is \$23 per month for one 65 gallon cart. The service will take the same items the household service will recycle.

RED CROSS BOARD CHANGES

The board of the Adair County chapter of the American Red has made some changes recently and have shifted roles of the board members to more advisory/fundraising. Robin Harden has served on this board for many years and has recently resigned due to the change in mission of the board. She will continue to serve as a board advisor but will not be a voting member of the board.

OUTDOOR POOL LEAK

The pool painting was completed on May 1 and the paint cured for the following week. We began filling the outdoor pool with water the weekend of May 11th but have discovered a fairly substantial leak. Rapid Rooter has investigated the pipes and thought they had located the leak in the same general location as the leak last year. The street/parks maintenance crew dug up the pipes in that area but no leak was found. We are now waiting to see where the water level stabilizes so we can begin to look at pipes in that area. This leak may force us to delay the opening of the outdoor pool because it takes several days to get the pool balanced and heated once it has been filled. We will announce any delays as soon as we have a better idea of what we are facing with the leak.
