## **RESOLUTION**

The City Council decided at the last Study Session to add a Resolution to the July 15th Council Agenda regarding House Bill 331. The Resolution would urge the Governor Nixon to veto House Bill 331. On July 5, the Governor signed House Bill 331 and House Bill 345 which takes away the ability for local officials to make decisions on the site, size, scope and impact of wireless infrastructure towers at the public's expense.

## **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING HUMAN RIGHTS**

Councilmember Moritz & Councilmember Mills have requested that the Human Rights Commission and anti-discrimination proposal be brought back to study session for additional discussion and possible future consideration. They would like to share additional information about the proposal including a better description of the issues and intent of the proposed ordinance. The Council should discuss if they would like this to be brought back to a study session in the future. Below is the information that Councilmember Moritz sent:

*I'm requesting that we can run the anti-discrimination proposal by the Council members at Study Session the earliest practical date, with the intent to reconsider a vote on it. Hopefully, being armed with additional information, albeit, more understandable language in today's restated ordinance - members will be more comfortable to discuss & understand the basic issues & intent of this measure without further adue.*

### **KIRKSVILLE HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION MEMBER RESIGNATION**

The City received the resignation of Mr. Cole Woodcox from the KHPC on July 3. The resignation email stated his decision to resign was based on the Council decision not to pass the Human Rights Commission Ordinance. Mr. Woodcox has served on the commission since its formation and was currently serving as the Vice-Chair for the commission. The City Manager sent Mr. Woodcox a response thanking him for his service. Mr. Woodcox's resignation was submitted by email so it has been included in the newsletter for your review.

### **MDC GRANT APPLICATION**

The KPD has been working on a grant proposal for a new shooting range that would be located at the old landfill site. The grant would be a partnership between the City and the Missouri Department of Conservation with both organizations contributing in-kind and cash to the project. The total project will cost \$210,953. The City's obligation, if awarded, would be 5% cash (\$10,550) and 35% in-kind (\$73,834). The grant proposal is due August 1 but the grant funding would not be available until July 1, 2014.

**Subject:** Resignation from Kirksville Historic Preservation Commission

Dear Chairman Shook,

As of the end of today's meeting (3 July 2013), I am resigning from the Kirksville Historic Preservation Commission in response to the City Council vote on Monday on the Human Rights Commission Ordinance.

Because the Council is unwilling to include me, a gay man, as a full member of the Kirksville community, I cannot ethically continue to serve as an official volunteer on a commission that works on the city's behalf. I regret that some Council members believe my access to the same rights and privileges they enjoy represents 1) an impediment to Kirksville's economic growth; 2) a legal liability to the city; 3) an increase in the growth of city administration and in volunteer citizen participation in government; 4) a violation of religious beliefs; and 5) an unnecessary financial concern.

Not only is Kirksville a place where people make a difference, our city is a place where different people make a difference. Different genders, religions, ethnicities, races, ages, sexualities, abilities, jobs, backgrounds, skills, politics, economic groups, languages. Discrimination that hides behind uneasiness about the size of government or about saving money is still discrimination against difference in our community.

My sincere thanks to the members of the Kirksville Historic Preservation Commission and to the city staff associated with it for their professionalism. I appreciate the valuable work you do to relate history, place, community and economic development to each other.
