MUNICIPAL ELECTION

Mayor Detweiler attended an Area Scene program and Councilmember Moritz appeared at the Candidates Forum to talk about the Transportation Sales Tax question. Informational brochures were handed out to citizens. Informational flyers were hung on bulletin boards throughout town. Signs on recently improved streets were placed around town noting that the Transportation Sales Tax paid for the improvements.

MML TRAINING WITH COUNCIL & REGIONAL MEETING

Stuart Haynes, Policy and Membership Associate of the Missouri Municipal League, will stop at Kirksville on his way to Canton on April 29 to meet with the City Council from 2:00 pm to 4:00 pm. Stuart will cover the Do's and Don'ts as a Councilmember. This will also be an opportunity for the Council to ask questions.

MML REGIONAL MEETING

The City of Canton will host a regional meeting of the Missouri Municipal League on Tuesday, April 29, 2014. The meeting will be held at Saints Avenue Cafe, 1703 Oak St, Canton. Registration and social hour will begin at 6:00 p.m. The buffet dinner will start at 7:00 p.m. The registration fee for the meeting (including the dinner) will be \$15 per person (tax and gratuity included). Following dinner, Bob Fleet, Health and Government Markets Manager at American Fidelity Assurance Company will provide a presentation.

PLANNING AND ZONING MEETING

This coming Wednesday the Planning and Zoning Commission will be holding a public hearing to receive input on the Comprehensive Plan and wishes to invite the City Council to attend this meeting and work with them on providing input and direction to staff on the update of our Comprehensive Plan.

NEW FINANCE DIRECTOR

A new Finance Director has been hired. Lacy King will begin her duties as the Finance Director beginning Monday, April 14. Lise Fuller's last day will be this coming Wednesday, April 9. Lacy is currently serving as the District Manager for the Adair County Soil and Water Conservation District. Mrs. King has also served as an accountant for Harden Cummins Moss & Miller.

CITY SAVINGS

Over the past year we have been working to evaluate our utility bills. A monthly fee of \$1203.15 was charged to our account. The City received a credit from Ameren in the amount of \$15,302.92 for the months that we were charged incorrectly. This is a credit that we had coming to us due to change in the billing and an inquiry we made asking for an evaluation. In addition, we have worked things out with the County on a telephone circuit that the City had been paying. They will be reimbursing us almost \$8,000 for that telephone circuit. The circuit has been cancelled reducing our monthly phone bill by almost \$600. On another small scale, we changed our telephone listings to reduce our monthly charge by \$166, which for both of these expenses is over \$9,000 savings.

DAY OF HEROES RECOGNITION

Several City employees were nominated for the Red Cross Day of Heroes recognition program. Included with this Newsletter is a release from the Red Cross on the nominees. The City was well represented at this event and the employees nominated were well deserving of the recognition.

REMOVAL OF TRAFFIC SIGNALS

The Airport and Transportation Commission reviewed a proposal from City staff to eliminate the traffic signals and removal of stop lights within the downtown area. The Commission wanted time to review this in more detail. Council should be aware that City staff had met with officials from ATSU, Northeast Regional Medical Center and The Northeast Missouri Health Council, all of whom were not opposed to the proposal outlined by Public Works Director Alan Griffiths. The proposal was intended to address several issues: safety, aesthetics, cost savings and efficiency.

LEGISLATIVE ISSUES

The following were issued from the Missouri Municipal League [HB 1067 Conway-104\(R\)](#) Requires specified businesses to remit their property and county and municipal sales tax revenues on tobacco products to local school districts instead of the local political subdivision. **Remarks:** Diversion of Municipal Revenues Related to Tobacco Sales: **January 30, 2014** HCS HB 1067 was voted out of the Local Government Committee with a Do Pass recommendation. Substitute language removed property taxes but leaves in place the diversion of both county and municipal sales tax on tobacco products to go to local school districts. **ACTION NEEDED:** Please call or email your Representative and let them know you oppose the diversion of voter-approved, general revenue funds to other taxing districts. January 16, 2014 a hearing was held on this bill and the sponsor indicated that an amended bill will be offered; primarily dealing with the removal of property tax and leaving in place the diversion of municipal general revenue sales tax. The diversion of municipal revenues is THE primary issue/concern with this legislation. MML testified in opposition to the bill.

[HB 1454 Swan\(R\)](#) Changes the laws regarding utilities. **Remarks:** Telecomm Wireless Deployment January 29, 2014 this is the companion bill to SB 650. Rep. Cathy Swan of Cape Girardeau is sponsoring HB 1454 for the telecomm industry. At the House Utility committee telecomm representatives from AT&T, Centurylink, Verizon, US Cellular, Google, T-Mobile, MCTIA, and the Missouri Broadcasters Association that would like to add language to include radio frequency to the bill, all testified in support. MML testified in opposition to the bill as did the city of Gladstone, Cape Girardeau, Kansas City, and Osage Beach. **ACTION NEEDED:** Please contact your representative(s) now and voice your opposition to the preemption of local oversight of the deployment of wireless facilities.

PARK BLOCK PARTIES

This summer the Parks and Recreation Department will be offering block parties in each of the neighborhood parks – Memorial Park June 7, Jaycee – June 21, PC Mills – July 19 and Brashear – August 2. The Department will have activities for attendees. This would be a good opportunity, if the Council were interested to use these as a way for the City Council and Department Managers to get out and meet with the citizens in these areas to meet, greet and learn if there are ways that we can assist the residents or improve our services. Would the Council like to take advantage of these four dates? The time for each event will be 6 – 8 pm. For more information and to see what other activities are being planned for this summer, see the Parks and Recreation Program brochure attached to this Newsletter.

NEMO RAAWKS

NEMO RAAWKS, which is an extension of NEMO Heart Health Corporation, the organization that raised the funds and placed all of the AEDs around town, is focused on educating and working with youth on developing healthy habits. RAAWKS stands for **Raising Active AWesome KidS (RAAWKS)**. They have approached City staff about adding signs near playground equipment in the City parks that would show how the play equipment could be used for exercise while playing. It would also give parents an idea

of ways they could keep moving while their children play. Included with this Newsletter is a very rough design of what the signs might look like. NEMO Heart Health plans on selling sponsorships to purchase the signs. If this moves forward, information could also be placed on the City's website.

YMCA

The City Manager met with the Executive Directors of Senate Bill 40 and YMCA to learn about an all inclusive playground that these two entities are partnering to develop. Initially the question was why public funds were being considered for spending on private property. The YMCA is partnering with the County and the County will lease the ground from the YMCA. The playground will be open for all regardless of membership in the YMCA. The City will be assisting Senate Bill 40 and the YMCA by helping with the environmental review and also supporting the oversight of the construction if the parties deem that to be of interest to them. The City will also be asked to send a letter of support for the project. On another note, the City worked out an agreement for this year with the YMCA and will be charging them \$5,100 for use of the Aquatic Center. City staff will evaluate the rates and fees charged to both ATSU and the YMCA this year and insure that consistency exists between the rates.

ROTARY PARK

The Rotary Club has provided the requested insurance and will now be able to move forward with the placement of the rocks around the new sign. The club will be in the park on Saturday, cleaning, painting, and sprucing things up. Since the Club is active in maintaining the park, would the Council be interested in asking for a member of the Club to serve as an advisor to the Lakes, Parks and Recreation Commission, not a voting member but someone similar to the concessionaire at 1000 Hills State Park, since there is mutual interest in the park.

BUSINESS ANNIVERSARIES

REPORT ON Missouri Municipal Clerks and Finance Officers Association Spring Institute

March, 2014

I appreciate the opportunity to have attended the Annual Spring Institute of the Missouri Municipal Clerks this month in Columbia. I was very happy to be present to receive my **“400” Hours** completed Credits Certificate from the University of Missouri.

I am the first City Clerk of Kirksville to have received the designation as a Certified Municipal Clerk (CMC) from the International Institute of Municipal Clerks in 1993; and the Missouri Registered City Clerk (MRCC) designation in 2004 from the Missouri City Clerks and Finance Officers Association. I also achieved entrance into the International Master Municipal Clerk Academy in 2003. Credit hours are obtained by attending the annual conferences of both the State and International associations. Each association keeps us focused on meeting those goals through our work place and seeking out educational training to obtain enough credit hours for these designations.

To summarize and highlight some points of interest to the City Council from the Spring Institute:

Political Savvy Session

Presenter: Ron Holifield, Founder and CEO of Strategic Government Resources, which is the largest private sector training company specializing in leadership, management and customer service for local governments in the nation.

Mr. Holifield shared Principles to Live by:

- Do things right and do the right things
- Do right and risk consequences
- Do unto others as you would have them do unto you
- Some men look at the world as it is and ask why? He looks at the world as it could be and asks, why not?

Mr. Holifield said that on the average - citizens have one meaningful interaction with the City offices in two years. That experience will set how they judge City Hall. To the citizen, it doesn't matter whether it is utility billing, police, fire or codes. Sometimes, citizens leave “mad” because they were treated “bad”. Others are known as the CAVE man (Citizens Against Virtually Everything). Employees should listen well and be empathetic.

Mr. Holifield directed the following for Council members:

- Don't take positions in private that you are not prepared to live with.
- Don't change your message for different audiences or circumstances.
- Don't think you have to have all the answers immediately.
- Don't look stupid.

- DO understand driving forces on issues.
- Define your core concepts.
- Make your message tight and focused.
- Remember we live in a bumper sticker world.
- Learn to be an effective story teller.

On behalf of the members of the Kirkville Area Master Gardeners (KAMG), I wanted to update you about the efforts of our members to beautify the gardens in the Kirkville city parks. Our members volunteered over 900 hours in 2013 in a variety of programs and services, from free gardening seminars to planting flowers at churches to assisting elderly neighbors with their gardening needs. For the City of Kirkville, our members maintain day lily beds in Brashear Park, Jaycee Park, Memorial Park, Roadside Park, and Rotary Park. The landscape of mixed perennials and annuals at the Veteran's Memorial Plaza and the perennial gardens at the southwest and southeast corners of Brashear Park are also maintained by Master Gardeners.

Other areas around Kirkville that Master Gardeners have adopted or regularly volunteer to maintain include the prairie garden in Rotary Park, the Senior Living Campus Energy Trail plantings, the community garden on Jamison Street, the Green Thumb Garden at Roy Miller Elementary School, the landscape at the Baptist Student Union, various gardens at Truman State University, and the flower beds at the MU Extension Building.

In 2013, 105.25 hours were recorded by sixteen of our members in the City of Kirkville parks for planting, weeding, trimming, mulching and deadheading in the landscapes and gardens. Independent Sector, a coalition of leading nonprofits, foundations, and corporations strengthening not-for-profit initiative, philanthropy and citizen action, estimates the average value of a volunteer hour at \$22.14. That means the Kirkville Area Master Gardeners contributed about \$2,330 in volunteer labor beautifying the Kirkville parks in 2013.

The Kirkville Area Master Gardeners look forward to continuing our involvement with the beautification of the city parks. The commitment of city dollars to support our efforts has been minimal, but adequate. We expect our needs for annual flowers and cypress mulch will be similar for the coming season. We'll begin our 2014 work this month. We hope we can continue to count on the City of Kirkville's investment in our efforts to make Kirkville's city parks a beautiful asset.
