HIGHWAY 136 CORRIDOR MEETING

There will be two meetings, June 9 (Kahoka) and June 16 (Unionville) to discuss the Highway 136 corridor. MoDOT officials from District Two will be in attendance. The City Manager will be attending the meeting in Unionville to learn more about this issue and the interest of all concerned.

STATE CORRESPONDENCE

The Missouri Department of Natural Resources has invited the City Council to attend a meeting, with other elected officials on July 29. There are two separate times 2- 5 or 6-9 at their Macon office, 1709 Prospect Drive. The purpose of the meeting is to give you a better understanding of the permitting, monitoring, and expectations that DNR has for our water and wastewater systems. We also received correspondence from MoDOT District Two Engineer, who will be leaving to fulfill his Naval Reserve responsibilities. Kevin James, Assistant District Engineer will be in charge during his absence. DNR Historic Preservation has also sent correspondence stating that the Travelers Hotel was awarded recognition as an historic structure and will be placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

BROOKFIELD BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION

Representatives from the City of Brookfield were in Kirksville on Friday to invite us to their celebration in July. Mayor Pro Tem Kuhns was available and presented the group with a proclamation from the City congratulating them on 150 years.

AIR SERVICE

The Airport and Transportation Commission has given the airline service several tasks to complete between now and September. The items include: 1) Change the afternoon flight to 4:00 PM departure from IRK to STL; 2) Participation in travel websites (Travelocity, Orbitz, Expedia, etc.); 3) Overnight (IRK origination flight) at Kirksville; 4) Match local funding for marketing and promotions; and 5) Reduction in airfare from \$69.99 to \$49.99. Air Choice One has already lowered their airfare beginning August 1 to the requested \$49.99. They have also taken the first steps in placing the air service on the travel websites.

EMERGENCY SIRENS

We will be visiting with the Council in the next month to review our emergency notification system. Emergency Management Director and Fire Chief Randy Behrens is working on notification coverage areas for existing sirens and options for future outdoor warning sirens.

NEW PARKING ORDINANCE ON HALLIBURTON STREET

(Kirksville, MO) – The Kirksville City Council approved an ordinance Monday evening, June 1 amending Chapter 15, Section 345, of the municipal code pertaining to parking on Halliburton Street. The ordinance change restricts parking on both sides of Halliburton from Jefferson to Franklin/Business 63

This ordinance change was based on a number of citizen complaints concerning parking on Halliburton and the potential hazards this parking created to the flow of traffic. City staff reviewed on a number of factors before suggesting this change, including that Halliburton is a major north/south collector street, the width of the street, parking being allowed in certain sections, the varied skill level of drivers, and the variable size of the vehicles parked and driving on the street. This ordinance change is now in effect. Enforcement of the ordinance change will begin as soon as signs are in place along Halliburton Street.


No operator certification hours will be awarded for this meeting.

The Missouri Advisory Council on Historic Preservation considered the proposed nomination of the Travelers Hotel, Kirksville, Adair County, Missouri to the National Register of Historic Places at their May 15, 2009 meeting. We are pleased to inform you that the council recommended approval of this nomination; enclosed is a summary of their deliberations.

The nomination will be forwarded to the Keeper of the National Register upon completion of any required revisions and final administrative processing. We will notify you of both the nomination's transmittal to the Keeper and, later, his decision. Generally, a decision regarding a nomination is made 45 days after the nomination arrives in the Keeper's office; however we often do not receive official notification until several weeks later.
