UPCOMING COUNCIL MEETINGS

meeting to accommodate this travel? The City/County meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, September 29 at 8:30 am to discuss items of mutual interest.

STREET REPAIR

Just a reminder that work has begun on our streets by our contractors. Halliburton is well underway. Cable Street should be finished very soon. Asphalt work has begun. A list of those streets scheduled for repairs is in this Newsletter.

JACOB'S WINERY

Russell and Sheila Pruet extend an invitation to their winery this Wednesday, September 23, from 6:00 to 7:00 p.m. The Pruet's own Jacobs Winery just south of town and have been working to establish this operation. They have asked that we extend an invitation to members of the City Council. The winery will be open to the public Thursday through Saturday. Directions: South Highway 63, past Hwy 11, to top of hill – Turn east by Clay's RV. Go 1.4 miles – house is on the left; take the "second" drive into the winery. Watch for the sign.

BRUSH AND LIMB

The street maintenance division of the City will begin picking up tree limbs and large brush on Monday, October 5th. This scheduled time is for all areas of Kirksville. Limbs must be set curbside by this date and time. The fall brush and limb pick-up will last the entire week of October 5th. Bagged leaves and other bagged yard waste will continue to be picked up by the Veolia ES Solid Waste Midwest LLC the last full week of each month on your regular trash day. The City also provides a yard waste roll-off container at the public works building, located at 2001 N. Osteopathy. This service is for bagged yard waste only, and is available Monday - Friday from 7am - 4pm.

BOW LAW

A citizen called concerned about the recent hunting allowance passed by the City Council. The resident asked whether the Council had any discussion concerning the types of bows that would be allowed, citing specifically cross bows. There was also a question as to whether or not there was an age restriction to the law. The answer to both of these questions was no. The citizen was told that his questions would be presented to the Council. Apparently, this individual has had some dealings with neighbors and the use of bows and is concerned about the safety.

CENSUS UPDATE

The following is an update on the Census 2010 Complete Count Committee. Jackie Gonzalez, intern has been developing a network of people from a variety of places within the city to help ensure an accurate count. She has also been working with the Student Senate at Truman to coordinate a 'Census Kickoff', that will be aimed at students to let them know that they'll be counted in Kirksville and why. We have yet to schedule a date, but it is either going to be late January or early February. The Committee and volunteers have been attending some events (7/4 parade, New Student Welcome) to distribute Census information so people realize the census is happening this year. It is Jackie's hope to visit the local elementary/high schools to talk to students about the census. The Census Bureau has developed several teaching exercises informing kids about the census, and so we as a committee are trying to help schools implement these programs so that kids will get excited about it, and as a result, parents will be aware to fill out the form. The information sent from the Census to schools included worksheets and activities relating to statistics, history, graphing and more. One of our committee members has been communicating with local superintendents to encourage the use of these materials,

but we have no actual contributions to the materials. They are all provided free from the US Census Bureau. The Committee consists of Jackie Gonzalez, Cherie Bryant, Alisa Kigar, Sandy Collop, and several members of Truman's academic administration: Sam Minner, Michael Kelrick, and Doug Davenport. Andrea O'Brien, the director of Residence Life, was also involved but has taken a new position. We are hoping to have another member of Residence Life on board. We have a student representative named Adam Crews who is working with the external affairs committee on Student Senate, who is playing a significant role on coordinating the kickoff. We have yet to secure a member from Kirksville Interchurch Ministries, but we have made several attempts. Jackie has also spent a significant amount of time working with the Partner Support Program, which will be providing some funding for county-specific Census materials and funding for the anticipated speakers for the kickoff (state rep/census rep). Jackie has submitted three grants and is awaiting their approval—one on behalf of our CCC, another on behalf of the Chamber, and another on behalf of Truman State. One has been approved and going through the vending process, the others are still in the process of being considered/approved. The primary role of the Complete Count Committee is to provide publicity for the Census, so that when people begin to receive letters in the mail, they will not throw them out and ignore them.

MIRMA UPDATE

We requested reimbursement from our insurance provider for the damage we sustained during the tornado. We had actual invoices for \$78,415.21 and the estimate of \$41,500 for the spot painting of the tower which total \$119,915.21. A MIRMA adjuster reviewed our invoices and has accepted \$88,642.76 in damages which includes the \$41,500 for the spot painting of the water tower. There was \$28,125.79 included for the costs of dumpsters. MIRMA was only able to honor \$413.61 of this. The good news is that Mirma approved the entire amount of the claim today and has sent a check and a release for \$87,642.76 (which is less our \$1,000 deductible).

SIREN INFORMATION

Last week there was a story regarding Macon's support from the USDA in assisting them in purchasing 3 sirens. The individual from USDA that serves Macon is out of Randolph County. This gentleman stated that Kirksville could receive the grant. Our representative, who is out of a different office (Hannibal area), told us that we were not eligible due to our population. We have scheduled a meeting with her for this week to find out whether we are or not. If we are, it may be one of those grants where priority funding is given to smaller communities. We appreciate receiving this information and will be following up with it.

BRASHEAR RESTROOM

MIRMA has assessed the replacement value of the Brashear Park restroom at \$34,235.84. Estimates for replacement of the restroom using a concrete building are a minimum of \$41,230. This building is similar to the restroom at 1000 Hills. The State of Missouri has an active contract with CXT for this model, which means that we can piggy back on that contract for our purchase if we want. There are a few options that we are exploring that could bring the cost to around \$45,000. Staff is currently researching other companies to determine options. Based on Council response, we understand we need to replace the restrooms we will need to determine best options factoring in costs, time and durability.

COMMUNITY BETTERMENT

On September 14, the Community Betterment judges were in town to visit with the Community Betterment Committee. Mayor Rowe welcomed the group to Kirksville. Several members of city staff were in attendance and gave presentations to the judges on a variety of topics. One of

those topics covered was the work done during and after the tornado. The annual Missouri Community Betterment Conference is in Jefferson City on October 18 and 19. Harriett Beard has remained active in Community Betterment over the years, and she will be attending the Conference. Kirksville has received awards in the past, and is eligible to receive more. Please review the schedule, and let Vickie know very soon if you would like to attend. Registration and hotel accommodations will need to be made.

INSURANCE INFORMATION

The City's health insurance fund is self insured, which means that we fund our plan up to our maximum claims liability, cover administrative costs associated with the plan, and purchase insurance coverage (aggregate insurance) to pay for those claims that exceed our maximum claims liability and individual (specific insurance) claims costs. Our maximum claims liability is budgeted at \$858,656. Our Medical/Dental Claims through August 2009 total \$807,061.79. Aggregate insurance will have to carry us to the end of the year once we spend \$51,594.21 (our remaining budget) which we could easily surpass in a couple of weeks. Based on these numbers our reinsurance costs will be going up, which means our only option is raise premiums. Our proposed budget includes a 10% premium increase. We will not know the actual numbers until we receive renewal numbers. Our claims breakdown is as follows: \$687,490 medical claims, \$69,561 prescription drugs, \$1,538 vision, and \$48,472 dental claims

RED, WHITE AND BLUE SERVICES

The Southside Baptist Church (Pastor Aaron Rodgerson) will hold their annual Red, White and Blue Sunday on September 27 by honoring emergency personnel. I have prepared the Proclamation for your presentation that morning. A copy of the Proclamation is attached for your reference.

FOREST LAKE AREA TRAIL SYSTEM (FLATS)

The following is an update from the FLATS Committee. 1) They have just a few minor items to complete on our Recreational Trails Program grant application, which is due in mid-September. The grant would cover the segment of the trail from Campground 2 to the Marina. Once the application is ready, Brent Stacy with DNR will attach the DNR's routing sheet, clearances, and other needed information to start the DNR's internal grant process. The DNR will then review the project with their landscape engineers and run clearances (environmental impact, etc.) for the project. 2) Thousand Hills (Morning) Rotary Club has signed on to be our primary community sponsor. This means FLATS will be working with them to build support and raise money for the project. 3) Students in Dr. Datha Damron-Martinez's Marketing Research course in Truman's School of Business will be doing an economic impact analysis study for the trail this fall. This information will help the group with grant applications and in a number of other areas. As I receive information, I will share it with the Council.
