KRAFT HEINZ PRODUCT LINES

By now the Council is aware that Kraft Heinz officially announced they will be producing bologna, cotto salami, and round white turkey, along with current square-cut ham, following their \$250 million dollar expansion of the Kirksville facility. The official announcement was made by Kirksville Regional Economic Development Inc. (K-REDI). Please see the press release attached to this Newsletter.

MARITZCX CALL CENTER

On June 29, 2016, MaritzCX announced that they would be closing their physical call center in Kirksville, and offering all but two of their 134 employees the ability to work from home. MaritzCX also sent a letter to former Mayor Richard Detweiler, which was received on July 1, 2016, announcing that the company would be laying off a total of two workers, per the Federal Worker Adjustment and Retraining Act ("WARN" Act). ALL AMERICAN RED, WHITE & BLUE FESTIVAL

The All American Red, White & Blue Festival was held July 1 through 4, 2016. The Festival was a success, in spite of the weather at times. City staff organized the All American Red, White & Blue Parade on July 2, 2016, at 9:30 am in Downtown Kirksville. The parade was the largest in at least three years, and for the first year ever, featured the new Kirksville Community Marching Band!

CITY ONE OF THE HEALTHIEST COMPANIES IN AMERICA FOR 2015

The City of Kirksville was named one of the Healthiest Companies in America for 2015 by Interactive Health for the first time. The City was recognized for achieving quantifiable results as part of its wellness program.

ADVANCED DISPOSAL RATE INCREASE

The City's trash rates are changing effective July 1, 2016. Advanced Disposal has made an annual CPI (consumer price index) based rate adjustment with an increase of 0.7% in accordance with their contract. Please see their full letter and the new rates attached to this Newsletter.

BALTIMORE STREET COMPLAINT

City staff were recently contacted by the spouse of a business owner on Baltimore Street who insisted that the City address a problem with the entrance to the business from Baltimore Street. City staff gave them the contact information for the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT). City staff also contacted MoDOT and MoDOT Area Engineer Amy Crawford stated that she would have their crews look into the problem. After investigating further, MoDOT claimed it was the business owner's responsibility, but is still discussing the matter as their policy makes reference to the "shoulder" of a road, and not curb and guttering like that found on Baltimore Street. City staff continue to work with MoDOT to try and address the issues we face on Baltimore Street.

MODOT STP-URBAN FUNDS AND MML

As last discussed in the June 1, 2016 Council Newsletter, MoDOT intends to reallocate STP-Urban funds, previously available to cities with a population of 5,000 or more, to their priority projects beginning in 2018. The Missouri Municipal League (MML) is aware of this change, and has encouraged its member cities to contact both MoDOT and their respective state legislators regarding this change. City staff will update the Council as MoDOT moves forward.

HEAVE REPAIR

The Streets Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department recently repaired a heave in the pavement at the Kirksville Regional Airport. Please see a photograph of the repair attached to this Newsletter.

HOMELAND SECURITY GRANT APPLICATION DENIED

Unfortunately the City of Kirksville's State Homeland Security Grant Program application was not selected for funding. City staff were sent a letter from the State of Missouri's Office of Homeland Security, Department of Public Safety, on June 23, 2016, informing us of the decision. Please see the letter attached to this Newsletter.

POLICE DEPARTMENT ELEVATOR

City staff recently received a quote from Missouri Stairway Lift Corporation in Columbia, Missouri, to repair the elevator at the Police Station. The quote came in at \$20,500. Certainly the elevator is used to move the trash receptacles, it is used to haul heavy items (including evidence), and municipal arrestees / citizens needing fingerprinting that are

unable to walk up / down stairs. The basement of the KPD serves as the City's Emergency Operations Center (EOC) when storm events and disasters have occurred. City staff are currently evaluating the necessity of repairing the elevator and will keep the Council informed. This was not a budgeted expense, and will not be repaired until funds become available to do this. The department is able to make alternate arrangements.

PERSONNEL UPDATE

Kayla Bachman was hired to fill our vacant Account Clerk position in the Finance Department. All full-time positions have been filled for the first time this year! Nonetheless, E-911 continues to recruit for a part-time Communications Operator, and Parks and Recreation is recruiting for part-time Parks Maintenance. City staff recently completed the annual worker's compensation audit and were able to reduce our premium but the general liability fees have increased. The funds for workers compensation are attributed to each of the departments with employees while the general liability is assigned to several budget funds. Budget adjustments will be needed, but the overall budget will not be increased. In June, 2016, four employees reported work place injuries with limited loss time to date. In the Fire Department, Firefighter Neff returns to full-duty on July 3, 2016.

AGING WORKFORCE

Aging government workforce has been a topic of interest for more than a decade with reports showing that government employers have more workers over age 45 than nongovernment employers. Emerging skill gaps suggest replacing that talent will be increasingly difficult. In the non-government workforce 44 percent of workers are over age 45. In education the percentage jumps to 51 percent; and in public administration it is 52 percent. The City of Kirksville is not immune: exactly 50% (or 71 employees) in the City's workforce are over 45 years of age. This means that we will lose our most experienced talent as workers retire or move into part-time employment as they age. The loss of job knowledge will be difficult to replace as the supply of qualified Generation Xers and Millennials will be limited. Retirement at some point is inevitable for everyone. The City has years invested in its experienced workers, but as they approach their earliest retirement date (age 50 for the Police and Fire Departments and age 55 for all other employees), if they do not feel valued, their level of commitment will begin to decline. Staff is working on a strategy to take continued advantage of the knowledge older workers have developed and educate employees on the benefits of working beyond the earliest retirement date, as long as they remain productive. While this focus is on the older worker we cannot lose sight that all employees are valued no matter their position with the organization and encourage them to learn as much as they can from the older worker to prepare them for future advancement.

MREIC AGREEMENT

The Missouri Rural Enterprise and Innovation Center (MREIC) currently utilizes Truman State University (TSU) as its fiscal agent. In recent months, TSU's now Interim President, Sue Thomas, has expressed to the MREIC Board of Directors TSU's unease in continuing to serve in that capacity. City staff continue to work with the MREIC Board of Directors and TSU to resolve this situation in a satisfactory way for all involved. City staff will update the Council as discussions move forward.

KIRKSVILLE IN AAA MIDWEST TRAVELER MAGAZINE

Kirksville was featured in the July / August 2016 edition of AAA Midwest Traveler Magazine. The article featured the city's history, its institutions of higher learner, the Downtown Square, outdoor recreation, community events, and places to stay. The article was made possible with assistance from the Kirksville Office of Tourism and Tourism Director Debi Boughton.

KIRKSVILLE AREA CHAMBER OF COMMERCE KIRKSVILLE MAP

Every few years, the Kirksville Area Chamber of Commerce produces a map for distribution of both the City of Kirksville and Adair County. The Chamber is gearing up for this project and has asked if the City's Engineering Division would assist them in developing the map for the City. The Engineering Division of the Public Works Department will work with the Chamber on this project, if necessary. City staff will update the Council if and when these new maps are made available to the public.

Kraft Heinz Investing \$250 Million in Kirksville, Mo. Plant**

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – June 20, 2016 – The Kraft Heinz Company (KHC) is bringing more product lines for Oscar Mayer meats to its Kirksville, Missouri, location as part of a \$250 million expansion project that's already underway.

Kraft Heinz is adding 200 jobs and seven new production lines for Oscar Mayer meats by the middle of 2017. The Kraft Heinz facility has been in Kirksville since 1985, where it currently processes ham products. As part of the Kirksville expansion, Kraft Heinz will begin producing bologna, cotto salami and round white turkey, along with current square-cut ham manufacturing.

Kirksville Regional Economic Development, Inc.'s (K-REDI) Executive Director, Carolyn Chrisman, stated, "With this significant investment, Kraft Heinz is committed to bringing new jobs and economic benefits to the Kirksville community."

The \$250 million investment will completely renovate the existing facility, nearly triple its square footage from 188,000 to over 450,000, and will include state-of-the-art food processing equipment. The new jobs will be open at multiple levels of employment, adding to the facility's current workforce of about 350 employees. Average wages at the plant for new jobs will be over \$19 per hour and offer excellent benefits. "Our workforce has always been a selling point for Kraft Heinz because they show up, work hard, and have the technical skills needed for the 21st century," stated Chrisman.

Kraft Heinz is utilizing Chapter 100 Bonds through the City of Kirksville, plus they received an incentive package from the Missouri Department of Economic Development Statewide Works program estimated at \$829,000 and Missouri Works Training assistance of \$75,000.

"This expansion means so much to the people of Kirksville," said Jennifer Gonzalez, plant manager in Kirksville with 22 years of experience at Kraft Heinz. "Everyone here takes great pride in the products we make and the values this company represents."

While *MaritzCX Research LLC* (the "Company") does not believe any of its actions are covered by the Federal Worker Adjustment and Retraining Act ("WARN Act"), 29 U.S.C. §2102 et seq.; this letter constitutes notice pursuant to WARN, and related Department of Labor Regulations, that there will be a closing by the Company of its Kirksville office, located at 2815 N Baltimore Street Kirksville, MO 63501. All layoffs involved will be permanent. Layoffs are scheduled to occur between September 16, 2016 and September 30, 2016. However, these dates are subject to and may change depending on business circumstances.

This notice is intended to comply with the Company's notice obligations, if any, of under WARN. The giving of this notice, however, shall not constitute an acknowledgment by the Company of any obligations under WARN in the event the effects of the closing are such that WARN requirements do not apply.

The number of affected employees set to be laid off is 2. None of the affected employees have "bumping rights," and none are represented by any union. While we believe we have provided all information covered by the applicable regulations, as required by Section 639.7(f) of the WARN Act regulations, we will maintain all other information on the layoffs which will be available on request. 

FIRE HYDRANT TESTING

It's important to test fire hydrants to ensure they are available and operational in the event of an emergency. That is why the Fire Department, in cooperation with the Public Works Department, conducts fire hydrant testing! The Fire Department is currently in the middle of conducting these tests on all fire hydrants across the City. We will be flow testing, or flushing, all hydrants to ensure they meet the requirements we have.

The firefighters use a diffuser on the outlet to avoid damaging yards. Before putting the caps back on, a special lubricant is applied to prevent the caps from seizing up during an actual emergency. As the fire hydrant testing progresses, occasional problems are discovered. When that occurs, the Public Works Department's Utility Maintenance Division repairs those problems. This process is repeated on an annual basis to ensure all City fire hydrants are in proper working order.



On Tuesday, July 19, 2016, your Cable ONE cable TV lineup will undergo a complete change. All changes will be complete by Friday, July 22, 2016. The new lineup will group similar type programming together making it easier to find programming categories such as News, Sports and Family channels. Plus, it will be much simpler to find high definition channels.

All News channels will be located between 333-345, Sports between 133-173, and Family programming 260-281. With the new lineup all high definition channels will be located in the 1000s number series, making it easier to find HD channels. For example, NBC-KSHB is on channel 41 in standard definition and NBC-KSHB HD will be on channel 1041. To receive a channel in HD, you must subscribe to the channel in SD and have an HDTV. Cable ONE delivers over 70 channels in high definition in the Kirksville area including NBC Sports, CBS Sports, NFL Network, TNT, USA, Syfy, A&E, WGNA, GSN, E!, BBC America, Hallmark Movies & Mysteries, History Channel, Travel Channel, AMC, TCM, Chiller and more.

Channel locations will also change for the Digital Value Pack channels. With the new lineup, Digital Value Pack channels will be found adjacent to Standard channels. The Digital Value Pack offers 25 channels, expanding your programming options with channels including The Oprah Winfrey Winfrey Network, Discovery ID, BBC America, NFL Network and The Blaze. If you are not a Digital Value Pack subscriber, these channels will have a message stating Access Denied.

As a residential cable customer Music Choice channels (801-850) are available as part of your cable package. The (49) different Music Choice channels offer a wide selection of commercial free music including Country, Jazz, Blues, Classical, Swing, Easy Listening, Oldies, Rock, Rap, R&B and more.

In conjunction with the lineup change, if you have a DVR or TiVo, with series, season pass or individual recordings set up, you will want to ensure the correct channels and shows are set up for recording after the lineup change. The TiVo guide may take up to 72 hours to update. The guide will update on its own, but you can also find instructions for manually updating the TiVo guide at www.cableone.net/lineupchange. We also recommend confirming that parental controls are set up properly. If your TV is connected to cable using a CableCARD you will need to rescan your channels when the lineup changes.

Enclosed is a channel comparison chart providing a quick reference of each channel location today and the channel's new location after the lineup change. A new channel lineup is also enclosed. For more information go to www.cableone.net/lineupchange.
