ADAIR COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT DRIVE THRU FLU CLINIC

The Adair County Health Department held their annual drive thru flu clinic on Tuesday, October 4, 2016, at the NEMO Fairgrounds. In addition to the drive thru clinic, the Health Department hosted a round table with representatives from various organizations. One of the things discussed was the possibility of establishing closed points of dispensing or PODs, that would allow for the distribution of more flu vaccines. The City would be considered for a possible POD should the Health Department move forward with this approach. All-in-all, the event was a success. Please see the attached flyer for the event.

NEMO RPC / RDC & SWMD MEETINGS

The Northeast Missouri Region "C", Solid Waste Management District (SWMD) Council will hold their Fall District Council Open Meeting on Wednesday, October 19, 2016 at the VFW Post No. 4958, 123 West Monroe, Memphis, Missouri. The doors open at 5:30 pm, dinner will start at 6:00 pm, and the Council Membership open meeting will start at 6:30 pm. The Northeast Missouri Regional Planning Commission (RPC) and Rural Development Corporation (RDC) Membership Open Meeting will be immediately following the SWMD Council Open Meeting. Please RSVP to City Clerk Vickie Brumbaugh by Wednesday, October 12, 2016, if you wish to attend. These meetings come on the heels of a recent NEMO RPC Transportation Advisory Council (TAC) meeting that identified a total of 38 needs across the region that must be ranked.

Interestingly, two of Adair County's highest ranked projects were the addition of a turn-lane on North Baltimore, and repairs to Baltimore between Patterson and Illinois. Please see the needs ranking sheet attached to this Newsletter.

DECEMBER 12, 2016 COUNCIL STUDY SESSION

The City Manager will be out of the office on Monday, December 12, 2016. Would the Council like to cancel this Study Session, or proceed with meeting?

HOLIDAY INN EXPRESS DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

City staff have received updated plans for the new Holiday Inn being constructed on South Franklin Street. The new plans have reduced the number of guest rooms from 81 to 74. The developer believes that this reduction in the number of rooms brings the project more in line with the local market. City staff will update the Council as this development moves forward.

BALTIMORE MEADOWS DEVELOPMENT UPDATE

During the past few months, City staff have sent additional letters to the Missouri Housing Development Corporation (MHDC) in support of the proposed Baltimore Meadows development on North Baltimore Street. City staff have also reached out to MHDC staff to discuss the proposed application. Public hearings for all proposals are being held across the state, including one in Columbia this month. City staff will update the Council as the project moves forward.

COMMUNITY HEALTH SYSTEMS AND NRMC

As you have likely read in the news media, Community Health Systems (CHS), the parent company of Northeast Regional Medical Center (NRMC), is experiencing financial difficulty following the acquisition of Health Management Associates (HMA) hospitals in early 2014. Those hospitals are the principal reason for the financial difficulties CHS is experiencing, and CHS is currently in the process of selling some of these hospitals. Those hospitals up for sale, were aware of this before any transactions occurred. There should be no concerns for the sale of NRMC. NRMC is not being sold and remains a profitable asset for CHS.

GLASS RECYCLING GRANT UPDATE

As last discussed in the September 7, 2016, City Council Newsletter, City staff received the go ahead from the State for the work to begin on the glass recycling bunker on August 16, 2016. Since that time, the Street Division of the Public Works Department has poured the flatwork for the glass recycling bunker while Stanton Contracting, which was awarded the bid for the balance of the project, is scheduled to begin later this fall. At the present time, the target date to begin curbside pickup of glass recycling is December 5, 2016. Curbside pickup will take place on the first Monday of each month. Outside of that time, the public may drop off their glass at Community Opportunities / the Sheltered Workshop. City staff will update the Council as work continues.

CELLPHONE TOWERS IN RIGHT-OF-WAY UPDATE

As last discussed in the September 7, 2016 City Council Newsletter, City staff were contacted by the company Mobilitie, which wishes to place roughly light pole-sized cellphone towers in City right-of-way. Mobilitie is a state licensed telecommunications company. They specialize in "small cell" mobile phone communications. This is specialized data management equipment that will take multiple cell phone messages, it will compress and manage that information, and then transmit that to a large cell phone communication tower. Their equipment helps to reduce the load to a cell tower and increases the speed of data transmission. Mobilitie plans to use City right-of-way to install a single pole in select locations to provide this service. The poles are approximately 80 feet in height and equipment on the pole is minimal and fairly unobtrusive. Per our interpretation of City ordinance and state law, they are not required to get a City franchise in order to do this work. There is a list of requirements for the work such as building permits, business licenses, a performance bond, right of way permits, etc., that they will be required to obtain before proceeding with the work. At this time, only one pole is needed. In the future there could be another pole, but it is unlikely that more than that will be needed, per the permitting manager for Mobilitie.

MOTOR HOME AND SEWER HOOKUP ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS

City staff recently learned of a resident and landowner who had located a motor home in their back yard, which was occupied by relatives of the landowner. That same motor home had a sewer line running into a clean out on the north side of Shepherd Avenue. Both the occupation of the motor home and its sewer hookup were in violation of City ordinance. City staff asked the owner to remove the motor home immediately multiple times, which the owner ultimately did.

MUNICIPAL COURT CASE

City staff were recently forced to pursue legal action against two local residents whose property is in violation of City ordinance. This is after City staff consistently worked with the residents to attempt to bring their property into compliance with City ordinance. The case made its way to Municipal Court, where the defendant made certain comments regarding the neighbor who has consistently filed the complaints against the residents with the City's Codes and Planning Department. Specifically, the defendant called the neighbor a "bully." This has prompted the neighbor to write a letter to the Municipal Court Clerk and the City Manager telling her side of the story. This letter was sent on to Municipal Court Judge Sutton who issued the following reply: "We have receipt of your letter. We must advise you that pursuant to The Missouri Canons of Judicial Ethics, the Court is not permitted to read/review information that comes to the Court from sources outside of the court system. The court is only permitted to receive information on a case from or presented through the Kirksville Prosecuting Attorney, the Defendant or Counsel of Defendant." City staff are bringing these developments to the attention of the Council as the defendant has appeared before the Council requesting a variance be granted for their property as a means of bringing the property into compliance with City ordinance. City staff will update the Council as the case moves forward.

In addition to this, Municipal Court is being plagued with new rules from the Missouri Supreme Court tying our hands in Ordinance enforcement. The latest ruling just came out defining Indigent Status in Municipal Division cases. If a person is found guilty and indigent they do not have to pay their fines and costs and in most cases cannot be incarcerated. We are looking into what other remedies are at the disposal of Municipal Courts.

CABLE CHANNEL 56 (FORMERLY CABLE CHANNEL 3)

Cable Channel 56 (formerly Cable Channel 3) is not updating. The old slides are playing but City staff are unable to upload new slides. City staff have been working with technical support to resolve the issue, and the unit that allows access to update Cable Channel 56 needs repaired. Before the unit is repaired, City staff are investigating the cost of a new unit. In the past, Cable One set aside \$1,000 a year for the City to purchase equipment for use in utilizing Cable Channel 56. Those funds were provided when Cable One had a franchise agreement with the City, however, the company moved to a State issued franchise, which grants the franchise and provides few other provisions and requirements to Cable One. City staff are currently checking with Cable One regarding the use of these funds. City staff will update the Council as this situation is resolved.

CITY STAFF BIOMETRIC SCREENINGS

As of the last count, 142 people have signed up for biometric screenings as part of the City's health insurance program. The biometric screening will be held next week, and the individual results will be sent to each participant. The biometric screening will determine whether or not employees will receive a discount in their insurance premium. PERSONNEL UPDATE

We have accepted applications for a new full-time Communications Operator and a Police Officer position (resulting from Cody Goodwin's resignation). We are working on a Safety Management Manual and training for all employees but especially safety sensitive positions that result in the most WC claims. In addition, we are working on payroll projections for Midwest Public Risk's renewal. These projections do not coincide with the City's fiscal year but rather will be for the period July 1, 2017 – June 2018. We are also working on updating the Administrative Policy Manual and Employee Handbook with a completion date of January 2017. We will be relocating the Human Resources storage area to the EDA building so I will be purging as much as the law allows before that time so we don't have to move any more than necessary. The current storage area will be used for glass recycling bin storage. The annual employee meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, November 29 so we are busy getting the Agenda together for this year's meeting.

DISPOSAL OF TAR TANKS AT WEST BURTON TRAINING SITE

There are currently tar tanks at the West Burton Training Site, utilized by the Fire Department. These tar tanks have been on the property since it was used as a facility for the Streets Maintenance Division of the Public Works Department. They have been unused for many years and are in the way. The tanks were posted for sale once with no response due to the buyer's responsibility for the work to move them. One person did express interest in purchasing the tanks, but required assistance with transferring them to his trailer. The tanks were then reposted to include that assistance. There was only one bidder: James Snyder. The sale of the tanks will be for \$50. Snyder may need assistance loading the tanks. He will know more as he evaluates the removal project. Heavy equipment may be needed to assist getting them to the ground and up on a trailer. City staff will update the Council as this project moves forward.

LPRC RECOGNITION OF MARSHA JONES

The Lakes, Parks and Recreation Commission (LPRC) voted at their October 4, 2016, meeting, to officially write a letter of appreciation, or Thank You letter, to longtime Chairperson of the LPRC, Marsha Jones. Jones stepped down from the position, and resigned her membership on the LPRC, earlier this year.

FALL ADULT SOFTBALL


