



GET OUT AND VOTE APRIL 8!

Kirkville residents will have the opportunity to cast their vote on April 8th to continue the one-half (1/2) cent Transportation Sales Tax. This tax is used annually for improvements and repairs to our City streets. The City is responsible for the maintenance of approximately 120 lane miles of streets. The tax, which generates approximately \$1.25 million annually, is used for transportation purposes such as: asphalt overlay, cold mix and seal coating, concrete reconstruction, reconstruction of existing streets, construction of new streets, roadway storm drainage improvements; and other transportation related infrastructure and equipment. In addition, 5% of this tax helps to support Kirk-Tran and the Kirkville Regional Airport. **The following is the official ballot language:**

QUESTION:

Shall the City of Kirkville, Missouri continue to impose a sales tax of one-half (1/2) cent for transportation purposes, which will begin on January 1, 2016.

On April 8, citizens will also have the opportunity to elect two of the five members of the City Council. Council members are elected to three-year terms. Those candidates, as their names will appear on the ballot are: Michael Ambrosia, Roger A. Edge, Sr., Richard "Rick" Steele, Jerry M. Mills.

HAVE YOU CHECKED YOUR WATER METER LATELY?

Per City Ordinance Sec 25-81, "At least once per year, the owner of the property shall read the meter and compare that reading to the most recent bill. If the reading is higher than the reading on the most recent bill by at least one thousand (1,000) cubic feet or two (2) times the average bill, whichever is greater, then the property owner shall contact the finance department. The property owner is responsible for any difference between the meter reading and the reading on the last bill. " Please remember to check your meters every spring and/or fall. By working together and checking your meters, we can ensure meters continue to function properly, and save you money.




2014 HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE DROP OFF



The City will continue offering a drop off site for Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) for all residents of the City of Kirkville. HHW will be collected 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m., on the following Saturdays: April 19, July 19, and September 20. Citizens must call the Public Works Complex at 660-627-1291 to schedule their appointments. Scheduled drop off appointments are required to ensure that qualified staff are available to assist citizens with disposal of eligible items. This facility is housed at the Public Works Complex, located at 2001 N. Osteopathy. The program is limited to household waste from citizens who live within the City limits and does not include disposal of any commercial hazardous waste.

Household Hazardous Waste is a broad term that applies to any leftover household products that contain corrosive, toxic, ignitable, or reactive ingredients. Items that will be accepted at the Kirkville collection site include: Aerosols, Antifreeze, Batteries-nicad, Batteries-alkaline, Batteries-lead acid, Batteries-lithium, Batteries-button, Ballasts, Bulbs-fluorescent, Bulbs-shattershield, Bulbs-HID, Bulbs-U-Shaped, Bulbs-crushed/broken, Cleaners-water based, Cleaners-ammonia-based, Corrosives, Cylinder-fire extinguishers, Fertilizers, Oil-cooking, Oil-used filters, Oil-motor, gear, lube, Paint-oil-based, Paint-lead based, Pesticides/Poison-Pesticides, Herbicides, Insecticides, Rodenticides, Miticides, and Fungicides.

KIRK-TRAN TRANSPORTATION



Have you taken advantage of Kirksville's public transportation system yet? Kirk-Tran is the only fully accessible public transit service in Kirksville and Adair County. OATS busses with the Kirk-Tran name and logo are available to all residents within a 15-mile radius of downtown Kirksville, regardless of age or income. Kirk-Tran provides a Demand-Response System and a Deviated Fixed Route System.

The Deviated Fixed Route travels along a set route in Kirksville between the hours of 7:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m., Monday—Friday. The cost is just \$2 each time a passenger boards the vehicle at one of the 20 local bus stops in town.

Patrons using the Demand-Response system are charged \$2 per one-way trip anywhere inside the Kirksville City limits, and \$3 per one-way trip outside Kirksville City limits within a 15-mile radius of downtown. SPRING APPLIANCE PICKUP SCHEDULED

The City of Kirksville is offering residents the opportunity to dispose of household appliances free of charge, regardless of whether it contains Freon. The pickup of appliances will be done by Perfect Metals USA, LLC during the week of April 21-25. Citizens should call Perfect Metals

USA, LLC, at 660-665-8000, to schedule a pickup of their appliances during the week of April 21-25.

Household appliances that are eligible for pickup include: Refrigerators, Freezers, Stoves, Ovens, Air Conditioning Units, Washers, Dryers, Dishwashers, Toaster Ovens, Furnaces, Hot Water Heaters and Space Heaters. Please remove any food or other debris from the appliance before the scheduled pickup date.

SAVE DURING SHOW-ME GREEN SALES TAX HOLIDAY

The City of Kirksville is once again participating in the Show-Me Green Sales Tax Holiday. From 12:01am on April 19 through midnight April 25, State of Missouri, Adair County and Kirksville City sales taxes will be exempted on the sale of certain energy star certified appliances, up to \$1,500 per appliance. Only appliances that have been approved by the US Environmental Protection Agency and the US Department of Energy, and display the energy star label, are eligible for exemption from sales tax under this holiday. Appliances that are eligible include: clothes washers and dryers, water heaters, trash compactors, dishwashers, conventional ovens, ranges, stoves, air conditioners, furnaces, refrigerators and freezers.
