ARE YOU PREPARED FOR SEVERE WEATHER SEASON?

With Severe Weather Season upon us, we would like to encourage you to plan ahead and know where to seek shelter. Here are some things to think about and a few tips should severe weather strike:

- What if you're in a store, lumber yard, restaurant, etc.? Where would you go if the sirens sounded while you were there? What if you are out in your car...What would you do?
- If your home has a basement, prepare it by stocking with spare clothes, water, food, first aid kit, flashlights, etc.
- If your home does not have a basement, identify an interior safe room. This should be a smaller room, with no windows, if possible.
- If in your car, get out and seek shelter in a substantial building.
