


2013 KIRKSVILLE REGIONAL AIRFEST



The 2013 Kirksville AirFest will take a new and fun-filled approach this year. On Sunday, September 8th, a FREE Airport Appreciation Day will be held from 12:00pm—5:00pm. That's right, there is NO ADMISSION FEE!

This year's event will include all kinds of fun things to do and see. There will be a bounce house for the kids, tandem parachute jumping, helicopter rides, tethered balloon rides, and a jaws of life demonstration. Food and souvenirs will also be available for purchase on site.

Displays will include a Medal of Honor AC-47 Gunship called a "Spooky", Grumman C-1A Navy Carrier Cargo Plane "Miss Belle", and the Macon Flywheel Club old-time flywheel engines. This is a good opportunity to learn more about the air service provided by Cape Air.

CITY AWARDED T.R.I.M. GRANT

The City of Kirksville was recently awarded a Tree Resource Improvement and Maintenance (TRIM) Grant through the Missouri Department of Conservation to complete the Master Tree Plan for Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery.

Crews are currently working to remove damaged and/or dead trees from the cemetery to make room for 36 new trees later this year. The fulfillment of the plan will increase the variety of trees at Forest-Llewellyn Cemetery, helping to prevent the loss of trees due to infestation, disease or natural disasters, as well as create a border around the Cemetery. Once the project is complete, there will be a total of 41 new trees at the Cemetery.

PROJECT HOMELESS CONNECT COMING TO KIRKSVILLE AREA

Homelessness is a problem faced by many each day in our community. Perhaps someone you know has lost their job and home and is now forced to live with family or friends. Or maybe you know someone who is living on the streets with nowhere to go. For one day, you can make a difference in the lives of others in your own community.

The Kirkville/Adair County area has been chosen by the Missouri Governor's Committee to End Homelessness as a host of Project Homeless Connect (PHC). The event will be held on Friday, October 4, 2013, at The Crossing located at 810 East Shepherd Ave., from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.

All homeless individuals and families in the Kirkville area are welcome and encouraged to attend a free, one-day event to connect with and receive free services and social assistance. The goal of PHC is to reduce barriers and improve access to services and housing for homeless individuals and families. During Project Homeless Connect, homeless individuals and families will have access to free services such as: medical screenings, haircuts, a hot lunch, housing assistance, identification assistance, food, hygiene products and much more.

Participants are encouraged to bring any proof of identification they may have, such as a Photo ID and/or two pieces of mail with the same address. A Kid's Zone will be available for free childcare during the event.
