## DON'T BE SURPRISED WITH A HIGH WATER BILL... CHECK YOUR WATER METER TODAY!



Many City water customers have remote reading devices located on the outside of their residential or commercial structure which are connected by wires to the actual water meter. Remote reading devices are in place for the convenience of the customer, and allow for meter readings to be taken on inaccessible water meters without entering and disrupting the residence or business. These remote readers are subject to failure due to weather conditions, connecting wires being cut or moved, vandalism or being accidentally bumped.



Pictured above on the left is a water meter and on the right is a remote reader. The remote reading is to the closest tenth while the water meter reading is more precise to the hundredth.

The City reads each remote reader monthly, and only reads the actual water meter when necessary to verify the actual reading if the remote reader has stopped functioning or indicates low consumption. Since the water meter is the device that actually records the amount of water usage, it is to the benefit of each customer to locate their water meter and compare its reading to the reading on the remote. If a remote has failed, consumption may have been billed too low which can result in a large billing when the actual meter reading is taken.

If the remote reading is less than the water meter reading, this may indicate the remote is failing or has quit functioning. Contact utility customer service at 627-1251 for further information.




