MOWING SEASON REMINDER

Spring is here and Mother Nature has blessed us with plenty of moisture to get the grass growing. The sound of lawn mowers can already be heard in many neighborhoods. Here is a friendly reminder of what the City's Ordinances are concerning weed and grass maintenance. City Ordinance states that all grass and weeds on all property in the City must be maintained by being mowed, cut down, removed, or under control, whenever they shall extend more than 8" above the ground. We are asking property owners to make sure that properties are mowed and maintained on a regular basis to comply. Maybe you have an empty lot somewhere, or a rental property without a current resident—Don't forget these properties. Your neighbors will appreciate it.

If you have a neighbor that doesn't appear to be taking care of the grass and weeds, please call the Codes Department at City Hall at 660-627-1272, or you can now go online to our new Citizen Request Tracker (CRT) system. When you get to the city website, www.kirksvillecity.com, simply click on the red "Report a Problem" button. Fill out a complaint online, and you can track your complaint through resolution. We will update you at each stage of the process as we work to correct the issue. If the complaint is entered anonymously, you will not be able to follow the progress, but it will still be addressed. 
AQUATIC CENTER ANNOUNCES SUMMER SCHEDULE

THREE CITY FACILITIES RECEIVE AEDS

Heart Health
Corporation**

The Kirksville Regional Airport, Aquatic Center and City Hall are now equipped with new Automated External Defibrillators (AED), thanks in large part to the NEMO Heart Health Corporation. An AED is a portable computerized device that can automatically diagnose cardiac arrhythmias and then treat them through defibrillation. These devices, when available and used correctly, can significantly improve the chance of survival when sudden cardiac arrest occurs.

The NEMO Heart Health Corporation is a not-for-profit corporation, intent on improving the "Heart Health" of the citizens of Northeast Missouri through awareness and education by obtaining, distributing and maintaining automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in the community. Their goal is to be aware of AED locations throughout our community to make sure we have adequate coverage to meet the need of sudden cardiac arrest emergencies at any location. NEMO Heart Health does monthly checks on these units and gives Basic Life Support training to business employees, which includes training on the proper use of AEDs.

The City Hall AED was sponsored by the Kirksville City Council; the Kirksville Regional Airport AED was sponsored by the Northeast Regional Medical Center Medical Staff; and the Aquatic Center AED was purchased through a Risk Management Grant offered by Missouri Intergovernmental Risk Management Association (MIRMA), with the remainder of the funds paid by the City of Kirksville and the NEMO Heart Health Organization.
